Brian Greulich seeks re-election as county councilman at large. Brian is a lifelong native of Spencer County and has been married to his wife Kelly for 32 years. Brian grew up in St. Meinrad. They have called Santa Claus their home for the last 20 years. They have two adult children, Heidi and Nikolaus.

Brian retired from Waupaca Foundry as their Environmental Engineer in 2020. He started at the foundry during the initial construction phase and then retired 25 years later. He received his Bachelor's degree from Oakland City University.

He currently is the chairman of the cemetery committee at the St. Meinrad Parish, the financial secretary for the St. Meinrad Knights of Columbus, and the treasurer for the Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree Assembly of Spencer and Perry County. Brian is currently the appointed councilman on the Spencer County Solid Waste Board. Previously he was on the Economic Development Board for 3 years as the county council appointee.

Now serving his fifth year in office, Brian has been instrumental in working with fellow council members to keep Spencer County's property tax rates well below the average in the State, and the personal income tax rate the third lowest in the state. Also besides routine budgeting, monthly additionals and transfers, etc. is a list below of a small sample of notable projects funded partially or entirely by the council:

- Jail repairs and improvements (security, HVAC, and structural)
- Flock cameras throughout the county to aid local and national investigations
- New Ambulance, 13 new defibrillators, and 15 chest compression systems
- New pavilion at the Spencer County 4H grounds for events
- Mariah Hill, Fulda, Lamar sewer systems improvements
- Wastewater improvements and repairs for Chrisney, Finch Newton, and Reo for maintaining their infrastructure, and foster economic growth
- Purchase 60 new up to date voting machines for the county
- New county government software for better efficiency and accuracy
- 10" water line from Holiday Village to Mariah Hill for economic growth
- Funded \$20,000 for a new roof on Christian Resource Center
- Partial funding of remodeling the Dale senior citizen & disability apartments
